## YOU ARE SALT OF THE EARTH

Dear friends, on this racial justice Sunday, there is no better reminder that the gospel can give us than that we are salt of the earth. Yes, we are meant to make a positive difference by fighting against injustice in any form. One form of injustice which we are invited today to fight against is injustice that has racial undertones. We must always bear in mind that we are all children of God, equal in dignity and deserving of respect and fair treatment irrespective of our physical appearance, our culture and history. To do this well, it is important to reflect a bit on what Jesus means when he refers to us, his disciples, as salt of the earth.

Jesus, during His memorable <u>Sermon on the Mount</u>, declared that believers were the "salt of the earth" and advised that it was possible for them to lose their flavour. If believers lost their "flavour," they would be of no benefit to others.

Salt is an amazing seasoning that adds flavour to food. Just like salt, we are not made to simply be the star and centre of attention. We are not made only for ourselves. Instead, it is our Christian duty to enter our world and add to it, helping to transform it into a world of grace and mercy, full of the "flavour" of God's Kingdom. This is done, especially, by the building up of relationships. It's done by striving to touch one person at a time to enhance their lives and help them to be closer to Christ. The love of God that we bring into our world, and into the lives of those whom we encounter, can be seen analogously as salt entering food and enhancing it.

So, let us commit ourselves to being the salt of the Earth so that this world of ours will be a better place, filled with the flavour of the Kingdom of God.

#### Petition to stop the introduction of abortion up to birth.

In 2021, abortion campaigners brought forward an amendment to a Government Bill that would have introduced abortion on demand, for any reason, up to birth (including sex-selective abortion).

This amendment did not go to a vote and pass, but the abortion lobby is expected to make another attempt to introduce this extreme abortion law change shortly. This would be the single biggest change to abortion legislation since 1967 and would introduce one of the most extreme abortion laws in the world.
